

## **Treasurer Report by Tony Klein**

I was asked if I could explain where our money comes from and where it goes. I will try to keep it brief and to the point.

In years past most of our money came from donations from cycling clubs like Team Revolution and Infiterra. Money was also available from grants for special projects such as the pavilion, the drinking well and lumber for water crossings, etc. We had also received a small portion of membership dues based on a Chapter's members. Since the downturn in the economy grants and donations have become scarce. Recent changes in the formula from the MMBA gave more money to the Chapters per the amount of members per Chapter. Under the old policy each Chapter would receive \$5.00 for each **NEW** member per quarter, under the new policy the Chapter receives \$.40 for **EACH** individual and family membership per quarter. If and when IMBA (International Mountain Biking Assoc) merges with the MMBA a pro would be more money to Chapters per their members. The bottom line is that MMBA memberships do matter and a larger portion will go to your individual Chapter.

As far as spending the money that part is easy. Your membership dues help pay for improvements to the trail such as the mile markers, lumber & hardware for water crossings, equipment maintenance, gas & oil, the purchase of new and better equipment (work smarter, not harder), trail day food, blade sharpening, equipment rentals, map & newsletter printings and the list goes on and on. I hope this sheds some light on our financial side. The sad thing about this is that we could have the best equipment in the world but if there isn't enough manpower to operate it, it sits idly by. Sure, your membership dollars help but someone has to get in the trenches. Come out and lend a hand, take pride in your trail system and meet some good people. Thanks!

Like most volunteer organizations, our chapter runs with the hard work and dedication of a few hard working souls.
